Team Uniforms: Sponsor name on back of a team's uniform worn by players, buddies and coaches. Grand Slam sponsors and above have logo on uniform sleeve for all 300+ players, buddies and coaches.

Banners/Signing: Your company's logo on a banner placed at park entrance for every game for Grand Slam and Home Run sponsors. Triple and Double sponsors have a sign with logo placed at entrance to park with Single sponsors sign with logo on their team's field.

Signage/Website Recognition: Higher sponsorship levels have preferred logo placement on website and promotional material. All website logos on the sponsorship page link to the sponsor website. Sponsors are encouraged to place the Buddy Baseball logo and link on their company website to promote the program and recognize their support.

Buddy Baseball Fact Sheet



About

Buddy Baseball is a non-competitive recreational league for boys and girls ages 8 to 22 with special needs. Each player is paired with a buddy to assist the player on the field and in the dugout. Buddy Baseball's inaugural season began in October 2009 through a dedicated group of volunteers attracting 36 players and 38 buddies forming 6 teams from the Tampa Bay area. The program has continued to grow as players, buddies and families accomplished more than was ever imaginable on and off the field. For our 30th season in the Fall of 2024, we are expecting 20 teams.

Benefits

The league allows friendships to form and barriers to be dissolved. It is an opportunity for children with special needs to experience the thrill of participating in a sport and celebrating the camaraderie of team play. The program also provides typical children ages 10 to 22 a chance to interact with the special needs community as a buddy in order to build awareness and acceptance of these children using baseball as a common connection.

Seasons

There are two, seven-week seasons per year with games played between 9:15 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. each Saturday and include a 15-minute warm up/practice prior to each game.

Spring Season – February to April

Fall Season – September to November

Participation

To register as a player, buddy, coach or volunteer, go to: <http://buddybaseball.org/registration/>

Players – Special needs players must be between the ages of 8 and 22 and enrolled as a student. A \$30 fee is charged to cover the costs of uniforms. Financial assistance is provided so all children can participate.

Buddies – The league is an approved organization with Hillsborough County School District for student community service hours. Buddies must be between the ages of 10 and 18 and are assigned to the same player each game. Buddies must commit to four of the seven games and participate in a buddy training session. A \$15 fee is charged to cover the cost.

Coaches/Volunteers – From coaches and catchers to game announcers and dugout monitors, volunteers are what keep the organization running.
